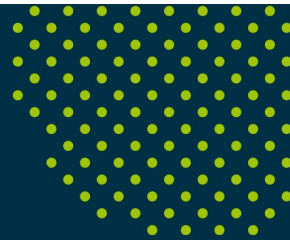


OUR HOMEBUYER'S GUIDE TO PICKING THE PERFECT NEIGHBORHOOD

03 Schools in the Spotlight

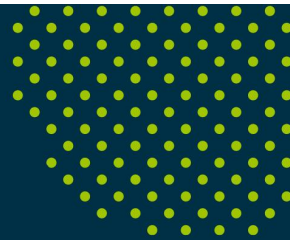
